Fort Henry Guard Day Camp

Fort Henry Guard Day Camp immerses youth ages 9-12 into 1860's garrison life at Fort Henry National Historic Site through an educational living history adventure shaped by play, friendship, and teamwork. Campers will get active all week participating in historic-based team activities, developing practical skills, and having fun with new friends.

Sample Camp Activities

- **Drill Sequence** campers work together to develop a 19th century marching sequence for presentation on the last day of camp
- **Garrison Journaling & Crafting** campers write in their journal from the perspective of a Victorian British soldier living at Fort Henry
- **Garrison Life Workshops** campers meet a member of the Fort Henry Guard who lead them through a special aspect of garrison life
- Hill Games campers get moving by playing team games on the grounds of Fort Henry
- **Baking Workshop** campers put on their baking caps and bake their own loaves of bread in Fort Henry's historic ovens

Please note that camp activities take place both indoors and outdoors and run rain or shine.

Our Staff

Fort Henry Guard Day Camp staff are Fort Henry Guard and Domestic historical interpreters who have demonstrated leadership skills and experience working with youth. Our camp counselors are hired based on their experience, enthusiasm, and creativity. All camp leaders are certified in First Aid and CPR and have on-site training in camper management, program planning, risk management, and hands-on programming sessions.

Supervision

Fort Henry Guard Day Camp has a Camp Director on-site responsible for supervision of staff, campers, and programming. From drop-off to pick-up campers are supervised by Fort Henry staff with a maximum staff-to-camper ratio of 1 leader to 10 campers.

Pricing

Fort Henry Guard Day Camp 1-Week Session: \$250.00 plus HST

Extended Care: \$40.00 plus HST

Extended care supervision is available from 7:45-8:45 a.m. and 4:15-5:15 p.m. at Fort Henry with supervised activities provided. Pricing is for the full week.

Health & Safety

If your child is accepted to Fort Henry Guard Day Camp you will be required to provide relevant medical information including any physical or behavioral conditions that may affect your child's camp experience by completing a *Health History Form*. This will include any medications, dietary restrictions, allergies, or special requirements that camp staff should be aware of to ensure that your camper's experience is positive.

This information is provided to camp staff and shared with your child's leaders as appropriate. Parents/guardians must specify if they wish to have staff carry their child's medication, or if the child will do so themselves. If your child takes any prescription medication the camp director can arrange to store the medication in a secure manner and your child will be reminded when it is time for administration. We cannot store or administer any non-prescription medication.

All medications must be listed in the Health History Form and be submitted to the Camp Director in the original container with the specific, unaltered directions of a licensed physician on the original prescription container. Please do not send expired medication to camp.

There are regular sunscreen-application breaks throughout the day. Camp staff will remind everyone to apply and reapply sunscreen approximately every 90 minutes. Staff will not apply sunscreen directly to campers unless parents request that they do so in writing.

Code of Conduct

The Fort Henry Guard Day Camp has rules to ensure everyone has a safe and fun experience at camp. This Code is our guide for behavior at Fort Henry Guard Day Camp.

The rules are made to protect everyone; to help make sure program activities are safe, fun, and successful, and to create a welcoming camp community. Everyone will treat other people, themselves, property, and equipment with respect.

The following are "unacceptable":

- Violence
- Bullying including name calling and put-downs as well as using technology, such as computers, text messaging, social media, etc. for these behaviors
- Cursing or verbally abusing anyone for any reason
- Fighting, threatening, stealing, damaging property
- Any action that endangers the wellbeing of self or others
- Leaving the group without permission

The following are **NOT** allowed at camp:

- Cell phones
- Headphones, music players, radios
- Weapons or look-alike weapons
- Intoxicants or any medication not submitted to camp staff
- Camp staff strive to create a successful and positive camp experience for every camper. While at camp your child deserves to have fun, try new things, make new friends, and enjoy the overall experience.
- Fort Henry reserves the right to send any child home who exhibits unsafe and/or unacceptable behavior that endangers other campers, staff, site visitors, or property.
- > Should this occur, parents/guardians are responsible for picking up their child in a reasonable timeframe as deemed necessary by the Camp Director. Persons listed as emergency contacts may be notified if parents/guardians cannot be reached.
- No refund will be given if a child is sent home due to unacceptable behavior.

Packing List

Electronic devices including **cell phones**, tablets, gaming devices, and smart watches are not allowed at camp. If found, they will be kept with camp staff and returned at the end of the day.

Emergency medications	If applicable (E.g. EpiPen, inhaler)
